

Combined interventions:

Combined interventions work best.

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Targeted interventions:

Interventions should be targeted at the 'precontemplative' as well as the 'ready for action' groups (and those in between) to build culture change as well as more tangible outcomes

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Tailored programmes:

Programmes should be tailored to the group or individual, recognising different cultural and contextual factors








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

Travel Mode Totals


The following pie and bar charts show the 1492 journeys grouped by travel modes.
